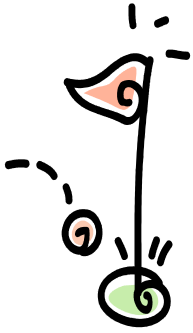

Playing golf or sponsoring a hole will aid our continued efforts in supporting the construction industry. Our NAWIC Chapter goal is to help the industry with a Scholarship fund and Construction Project.

Scholarships:

Our scholarship fund is offered to tradeswomen and undergrad students pursuing a construction related degree. The number of scholarships granted depends on the proceeds from our annual Golf Tournament and our Holiday Brunch. Since 1981, with your generous help, we have given over \$45,000 in scholarships.

Our Construction Project: “The Oaks”

The Oaks is a family style home located in a residential area of Blaine, which provides housing and services to three men and one woman who are quadriplegic and ventilator dependent. The house is owned by Becklund Outreach and Anoka County Community Action Program, both of which are non-profit organizations. The goal is to provide affordable community-based housing for severely handicapped individuals.

Proceeds from the NAWIC Golf Tournament have provided: adding and staining decks, wallpapering, painting, lighting and new living room furniture. We have added a fire sprinkler system, an emergency generator, replaced sinks and the stove/oven, along with new concrete driveway. This year new carpeting for the living room and hallway, was donated by Becker Brothers and NAWIC proceeds paid for the installation.

Our Community Help:

Hearts and Hammers

For the past four years, our Chapter has volunteered with Hearts and Hammers, an organization that assists homeowners who have limited access to home-improvement programs, specifically the elderly and those who are physically disabled. We are proud to be a part of Hearts and Hammers.

MAGIC

Summer of 2010 NAWIC will host their first MAGIC camp for girls in high school. Mentoring A Girl In Construction is a national program started in 2007. A week long summer camp where each day the girls learn a new construction trade including concrete, framing, electrical, mechanical and drywall, ending with a finished product.

Girl Scouts

Every year during our women in construction week we mentor girl scout troops by showing them different career aspects in construction along with some hands on experience. This year Grazzini Brothers hosted 20 girl scouts and taught them that granite, a natural product, can be processed for use. Each girl designed tiles and glued them on a board they took home.

Block Kids

We conduct an Annual Block Kids Contest which is a regional and national contest that encourages youngsters to create or build whatever they desire with lego-type blocks, string, foil and other items. The Block Kids Contest is aimed at our industry’s future workforce, our elementary school children in grades one through six. This year we hosted 84 students at Sacred Heart Elementary School in Robbinsdale.
